## **MEMBER PROTECTION POLICY SEACLIFF HOCKEY CLUB INC.**

### **1. STATEMENT**

The Seacliff Hockey Club ('the Club') is committed to provide an environment safe for children and that is free from harassment, discrimination and abuse for everyone, and promotes respectful and positive behaviour and values.

believes that all people have the right to work, play and socialise in an environment that is safe and inclusive. The Club regards violence, unlawful discrimination, sexual harassment, bullying and abuse in any form as intolerable. We will strive to ensure that members are provided with a safe environment in which to play hockey.

Any reports of inappropriate behaviour will be treated seriously, sympathetically and confidentially and, where necessary, will be investigated thoroughly. The Club will take reasonable steps to ensure that complainants and witnesses are not victimised in any way.

This Policy includes Child Protection, Images of Children, Anti-Discrimination & Harassment, Sexual Relationships, Pregnancy, Gender Identify, Alcohol, Smoking, Cyber Bullying and Social Networking Policies as well as Codes of Behaviour.

The Club aims to promote ethical and informed decision-making and responsible behaviours within the hockey community.

The Club has adopted the Hockey Australia Member Protection Policy as updated and applicable to South Australia.
